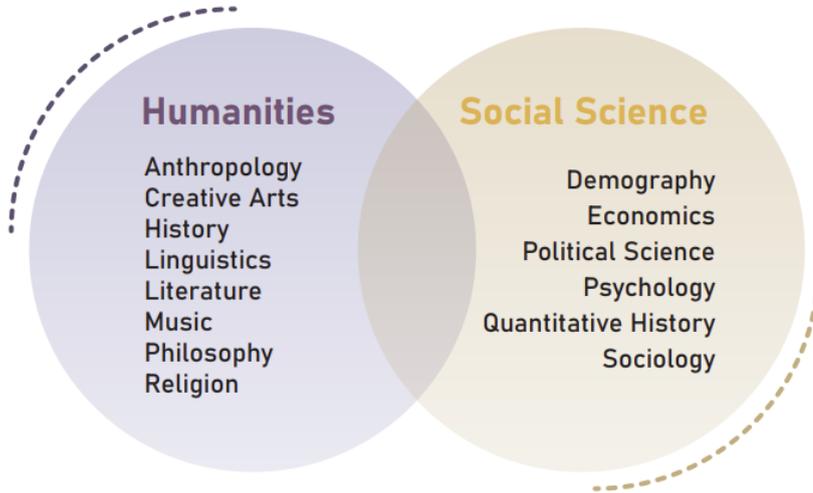

<b>Class Format</b>	Lectures, computer simulations, case discussions, individual and group projects.
<b>Attendance</b>	Class participation is mandatory and part of the student's final grade in most courses. Select your courses carefully and enroll only if you can commit.
<b>Course Requirement</b>	Exchange students can select SHSS courses as long as they meet the prerequisite requirements and are subject to space availability. Some courses may require professor approval for enrollment.
<b>Examinations</b>	Final exams are within the last 2 weeks of school. Students are responsible for staying in HK until the last day of finals. Requests for early leave of exams are normally not considered.

**Living In Hong Kong**



<b>Language</b>	Locals speak Cantonese while English and Mandarin are widely spoken.
<b>Getting Around</b>	Hong Kong's public transportation system is considered to be world-class in terms of its efficiency. Getting around by Mass Transit Railway (MTR), Bus, Taxi is relatively quick.
<b>Telecommunication</b>	WiFi is widely available, including airport, major tourist attractions, MTR stations and restaurants. You can purchase a prepaid SIM card or <a href="#">Discover Hong Kong</a> Tourist SIM card easily.
<b>Banking</b>	Most international banks have branches in Hong Kong. On HKUST campus, there are two banks: Hang Seng Bank and Bank of China.

- Only undergraduate students might be accommodated in double occupancy student halls. It is **NOT** guaranteed, subject to availability. Room preference is not entertained.
- Hall assignments are all decided by the housing office. Details to be stipulated in the application portal.
- For postgraduate students, [off campus accommodation](#) is available near Clearwater Bay, such as Hang Hau just 15 minutes from campus on public transports or Sai Kung.
- The price range is from HK\$7,000 - 10,000 per month for a single room. Rates, government rent and management fees exclusive.

### Student Visa

- For all incoming exchange students (non-Hong Kong citizens), you are required for a student visa to study in HK. Student visa documents must be submitted in a **TIMELY** manner or will be withdrawn.
- Please expect that student visas may take up to 3 months to be approved by the Director of Immigration Department of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR).
- For Mainland Chinese students holding PRC passport, you will need an additional 2-4 weeks to apply for an EEP from your hometown after you have received your approved visa label.
